### Where Can You Find Us?

The English Department is located in two buildings, PLH (at Plattenstrasse 47) and PET (at Pestalozzistrasse 50). Both are in walking distance from the university main building at Rämistrasse 71.

### **PLH-Building**

In addition to three classrooms (PLH-05, PLH-102, and PLH-105), the building at Plattenstrasse also houses the Kafistübli, a common room for students of English.

# **PET-Building**

The English Department Library, as well as a fourth classroom (PET-04), are located at Pestalozzistrasse.

### **English Department Library**

The holdings of our open-stack library comprise circa 60,000 books relevant to the field of English Studies, as well as numerous journals, audiobooks, and films.

### **Walking Distance from the Train Station**

From the main station (Hauptbahnhof), it's about a 25-minute walk to the English Department; from Bahnhof Stadelhofen, it's only about 15 minutes.

## **Tram Stops**

- trams 5 or 9 to Kantonsschule
